## E-letter sent to the King on 9th February

### Press release in March 2024 for Princess of Wales

## THE IOLAIRE REMEMBERED

A commemoration and wreath-laying service took place at the Iolaire Memorial at Holm on New Year's Day 2024. The service, led by Rev James MacIver, was attended by relatives of those lost, members of the public, Lord-Lieutenant, Convenor and Chief Executive of Comhairle nan Eilean Siar, along with representatives of the local branch of the Royal British Legion and a number of other local organisations. The weather was favourable, remaining dry throughout. Two hundred and one lives were lost out of the 280 men on board when HMY Iolaire hit rocks and sank at the Beasts of Holm, about a mile from Stornoway Harbour, making it the UK's worst peacetime maritime disaster.



With Rev MacIver retiring as Minister of Stornoway Free Church in the summer, we express our grateful thanks to him for his commitment in leading this commemoration service for a number of years.

We all wish him a long and healthy retirement.

## LORD-LIEUTENANTS' ASSOCIATION MEETINGS

I attended the Annual Lord-Lieutenants' Seminar and AGM in London on 21st and 22nd May which was attended by Lord-Lieutenants from throughout the UK. The Seminar covered presentations on the role that Lieutenancies can play in promoting understanding between faiths and communities. Guests included The Very Rev Dr John Chalmers, a former Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

The following day at St James's Palace, the AGM included interesting and detailed addresses, covering the Royal Household and The Royal Foundation.

The Scottish Lord–Lieutenants' AGM took place in the Palace of Holyrood House on 27th March with presentations from the Scottish Government providing an update on Honours (Scottish Process), Dr Joseph Morrow, Lord Lyon on Ceremonial matters, Sir Edward Bolitho, Chair Lord –Lieutenants' Association on UK Lieutenancy business and Major General Sir Robin Lindsay, Operational Commander, Royal Regiments of Scotland on military matters.
